






Background: Phase 1 – Sustainability Guidelines

- New chapter of City's Development Design Guidelines
- Applies to Secondary Plans, Block Plan, Plans of Subdivision, Site Plans
- Approved by Council in 2013
- New development applications required to demonstrate how they integrate the SCDG's through their design submission (Urban Design Guidelines, Community Design Guidelines)





Background: Phase 2 - Sustainability Metrics

- Focus on scales of development (e.g. Block Plan, Draft Plans, Site Plans)
- Applicable to Greenfield, Redevelopment and Intensification Area
- Three Performance Tiers:
 - 1) Mandatory Requirements current municipal standards
 - No points awarded
 - 2) Recommended Minimum "doing better"
 - Points awarded
 - 3) Aspirational "best in class"
 - Points awarded



Background: Sustainable Thresholds

- Approved by Council in 2015
- Bronze Threshold = 10% above historic average scores
- Applications are "encouraged" to meet Bronze Thresholds




Submissions: Sustainability Score and Summary

2016 Planning Approvals:

- 22 Plans of Submission
- 2 Block Plans
- 30 Site Plans
- Less than 5% not achieving Bronze threshold







Update: Revised Site Plan Process


- Sustainability Score and Summary requirements
- Specific exemptions identified:
 - Limited small, single items (i.e. additional windows or doors)
 - Basic smaller projects (i.e. additions, parking lots, etc.)
 - Full new builds, large additions

C.10 Sustainability Assessment

Improving the sustainability of our community occurs at all stages of development from conceptual design right through construction by making choices that will improve the natural and built environment.

The Sustainability
Assessment is designed
to encourage Applicants
to consider
sustainability in a range
of areas from the
physical layout and
preservation of natural
features to choices
about the use of
materials and
technology when they
make decisions about
their proposal.

In support of the COB's commitment to elevate the level of sustainable development within our city, Applicants (generally those involved in Full Site Plan Reviews) are required to answer questions about their proposal by completing a Sustainability Score and Sustainability Summary to be submitted with their Site Plan Application.



Note: Only development proposals that meet certain criteria are required to provide Sustainability information about their proposal. Applicants will be informed during the PAC Meeting about whether their proposal meets the criteria.









