
## **Key EcoHealth Objective**





### **Case Study Example: York Region**

- Strategic documents work together to advance the concept of health greenspaces and population health benefits
- Broad vision and goals found in Vision 2051 are reinforced through policies in other plans
  - Regional Official Plan
  - New Community Guidelines
  - Greening Strategy
  - Forest Management Plan






#### **Case Study Example: Brampton**

- A multi-faceted approach is used to guide land use planning and decision-making through local plans, guidelines and strategies.
  - Official Plan
  - Strategic Plan
  - Sustainable Community Development Guidelines
  - Natural Heritage and Environmental Management Strategy






### **Case Study Example: Thunder Bay**

- Adopted a multi-pronged approach to advance community health, community design and natural areas priorities using a variety of strategic documents and implementation tools:
  - Corporate Strategic Plan
  - Implementation Plan
  - Working Together for Healthy Kids Strategy
  - Urban Design and Landscape Design Guidelines







### Case Study Example: Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit

- Developed a useful tool to connect community health to land use.
- The tool provides short, medium and long-term implementation options
- Policy Statement example:
  - "Design standards ... that require the use of natural landscapes to improve air and water quality throughout the community"


