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Victoria Engaged a Supplier to Decrease Packaging Waste

After a contractor brought up concerns about individually-packaged light fixtures, the City worked with the supplier to bulk package fixtures in Phase 2 of their LED streetlight conversion

Results:

- 60,000 ft² of cardboard saved in Phase 2
- Facilitated material handling for the installation contractor





Winnipeg Became a Fair Trade Town



Throughout 2017, the Fair Trade Winnipeg Steering Committee worked in partnership with the City of Winnipeg to increase fair trade education and awareness in our communities, workplaces, faith groups, and schools.

Results:

 The City achieved Fair Trade Town designation, solidifying a formal commitment to purchase Fairtrade Certified coffee, tea, and sugar where these products are purchased using public funds.
