





- The Federal government \$120 billion over 10 years.
- The Province of Ontario \$160 billion over 12 years.



- Federal Infrastructure Clean Water and Waste Water Fund (2016)
- Great Lakes Protection Act (2015)
- Ontario's Climate Change Strategy (2015)
- Provincial Policy Statement (2014)
